# Extended bio

## Barbara Dover

Barbara Dover's work grapples with the representation of the experiences, sensitivities and understandings of animals. In doing so, Dover is among a growing number of contemporary artists who are seriously interrogating and discarding the established hierarchies in the portrayal of animals in visual art. The challenge arises for Dover in confronting, as Schlosser (2012) remarks, "... the dilemma of understanding animal minds through the vehicle of the body"<sup>1</sup>. Dover's work touches upon our ethical and moral responsibility towards animals where animals' lives and needs are important. Questions and conundrums are raised about the moral and physical boundaries of our relationship with animals. She is concerned with visualising animal-human encounters within the consideration of the sentience of animals and the rich complexity of their lives.

Drawing from her continuing and predominant interest in our attitudes to and treatment of non-human animals, Dover probes the familiarities, experiences and intricacies of relations between humans and animals. Looking both in the past and present, at the variety of perspectives and complex ways in which we interact with animals, leads to the questions: what, essentially, is an animal and what, in fact, is a human? These questions carry us into areas, as philosopher Mary Midgley states, of "moral and emotional meaning which are both vast and, by their nature, threatening, so they are hard to explore". The relationship of humans and animals is a paradoxical and vexed one. We have made gods of animals, yet we destroy them. We make pets of some animals and food from others. We look to animals in both science and art; animals are the source of both knowledge and poetry; and animals inhabit our physical world and our imaginative world. Our connection with them has indelibly formed our thought and language about ourselves and our environment.

In these investigations, she works across various media and forms including photography, installation, assemblage, video and drawing while connecting with the knowledge of other fields including philosophy and ethology among others. Dover is among an increasing number of contemporary artists who are seriously interrogating and discarding the established hierarchies in the portrayal of animals in visual art and demonstrating contemporary art's important contribution to current questioning of the moral, ethical and physical boundaries of our relationship with animals within the emerging cross-disciplinary area of animal studies.

Born in Bendigo, Victoria, Dover lived and worked in Melbourne before moving to Cairns. While continuing her art practice, she has taught visual arts at TAFE in Cairns.

Dover gained a Graduate Diploma in Arts and Education from Deakin University and a Master of Creative Arts and PhD from James Cook University. Her earlier qualifications include secondary art teacher training and Diploma of Art and Design (Drawing). Dover exhibits regularly in group exhibitions and collaborations including the touring exhibition, *Disquiet: Ecological Anxieties and Transformations* in 2020-2021, *Call of the Running Tide*, a sculpture event in Port Douglas in 2019, and her solo exhibitions include *Face to Face*, KickArts Contemporary Arts Gallery, Cairns and *Interrogating Gaze*, Pinnacles Gallery, Thuringowa, both in 2007; *Animal Matters II* at SoapBox Gallery, Brisbane, 2005; and *Animal Matters*, Cairns Regional Gallery in 2003.
